Welfare Ecosystem

Thousands of families, most of them living in rural areas, are affected by the fact of not earning enough money to have a balanced diet, a decent house, or education; and also, the opportunities to improve their quality of life are just a few. For that reason, CMT developed and implemented social programs through 11 different networks in the Welfare Ecosystem Model, so as to help young people, parents, students, and children; because they all live in vulnerable situations.

The organization started a transformation process in order to grow, face challenges and fight social backwardness. It developed a functional structure which included factors that have impact on issues like health, social and economic development, and welfare.

The Welfare Ecosystem Model is the structure that allows CMT to focus and lead its programs to benefit people who need help. It aims to have a positive impact on the rates of marginality, and also to encourage good practices among the citizens, as they all together can improve public policies.

Rural communities


According to data provided by the National Council for Evaluation (CONEVAL), one out of four indigenous people live in situations of poverty, and such a fact was considered an "alarming" number.

Housing in those areas is built with cardboard, sticks, metal sheets, and sometimes people can only use pieces of fabric to protect the areas they live in. They do not own a decent restroom and they are able to build latrines only in order to cover their basic needs.

CONEVAL reveals that the economic structures in indigenous areas are mainly committed to agriculture, as this is their only way to get jobs and salaries. However, that is not enough if they want to get a basic food basket, medical assistance, benefits at work, or rights in any of those areas.

Due to that, CMT promotes programs to help people in vulnerable situations to allow the improvement of their living conditions and quality of life. The objective is to provide them with opportunities to develop, and to help Mexican families to combat the precariousness in the

The Welfare Model developed by this organization helps the most vulnerable people and it provides benefits through one or more of the Welfare Networks in the Model. The only purpose is the improvement of their housing, education, economy, support to agriculture, among others.


