Since that moment, her particular gifts, efforts, heart, and talent have improved the lives of thousands of people around the world.

After seeing thousands of families losing all they had to guarantee stability in their lives, in 1995 she created a Volunteer's Board, and years later it became what we know as Congregación Mariana Trinitaria, A.C., whose main objective is to prevent diseases through an integral perspective.
